Be Part of Community-led Grantmaking

The purpose of the Koʻolau Pilina Fund is to build community resilience in the Koʻolau region. It follows a participatory approach to grantmaking in which a committee made up of Koʻolau community members will vet proposals through an open, rolling application process. The fund prioritizes projects specifically tailored to Koʻolau communities on Oʻahu from Kahuku to Makapuʻu and is supported by the Harold K.L. Castle Foundation.

The fund aims to foster *pilina* with, among, and beyond community defined as strengthening relationships but also driving equity, sharing risk, and collectively creating value. Learn more here.

The Kuleana

The foremost responsibility of committee members is to commit to work constructively with fellow members and Foundation staff to collaboratively shape the program, evaluate small grant proposals (up to \$15,000) and make recommendations for funding from **January 2026 to December 2027 (2-year term)**. Currently, the Pilina Fund Committee prioritizes projects that create more opportunities for:

- Strong 'ohana & safe, supportive, prepared and resilient communities
- Increased access to 'āina and farming & improving food security in the region
- Improving health and wellbeing
- · Community-based education and learning

Specifically, this commitment includes (1) your required attendance at **monthly** Committee meetings and trainings to bring your deep experience of assisting communities within Koʻolau to the group, (2) your informed and diverse perspective to vet and recommend projects quickly and diligently for the Foundation to award by reading and scoring batches of short grant applications before each grantmaking meeting, (3) your advocacy for the fund in sharing the opportunity with those in your community, and (4) your active listening to learn about opportunities the fund can support. The committee meets monthly to orient to the funding program, identify priorities, vision desired outcomes, shape pilina building events and resources for the community and, of course, make decisions on grant applications. Members will be asked to sign a Commitment Statement which includes a Conflict of Interest Disclosure and Confidentiality Agreement.

It is meant to be a vehicle by which to learn, grow and be a positive agent for change in your community.
